Hampton

After leaving Walton RC, we go through Sunbury Lock and along the south side of Platts Eyot, so we miss two famous rowing schools which are on the north side – <u>Hampton School</u> and <u>Lady Eleanor Holles school</u>. However we can see <u>Garrick's Temple to Shakespeare</u>, built by the famous actor-manager David Garrick in 1756 to celebrate the genius of William Shakespeare.



One advantage of our virtual tour is that we have time to visit Hampton Court Palace, built in 1515 for Cardinal Wolsey who then gave it back to King Henry VIII. In the following century, William III rebuilt and expanded much of the palace, destroying some of the Tudor building and leaving a palace of two halves.
