

Touring Glossary

Windlass / lock key Handle used to wind the mechanism of the lock paddles

Rack Teeth that the pinion sits in

Pinion Cog that the windlass attaches to in order to winch the paddles open and closed

Safety Catch Stops the pinion slipping

Paddle The panel that opens or closes the sluice that fills or empties the lock chamber

Paddle / winding gear

Mechanism encompassing all the above to work the paddles

Cill The ledge that extends below the upper gate of the lock

'Turning' a lock Emptying or filling a lock

Booms Floats that form a safety barrier, usually in front of a weir **Rise** The change in the lock's water level

Reach/Pound The stretch of water between locks

Chamber The lock's enclosure between the gates

Marker buoys Buoys that mark the channel

Fairway The main navigation channel in the river

Winding Hole Place for boats to turn

Balance Beam Balances the weight of the gate and gives leverage when opening and closing it.

Port

Left hand side of the boat when facing the direction of travel

Starboard Right hand side of the boat when facing the direction of travel
